
SOROR ACCOLADES







Science is an essential academic course that expands behind high school. Alpha Kappa is privileged to have as a member, Dr. Shelley McIntosh, who along with Dr. Marion Godine founded Child Focused Consulting, LLC. 15 years ago to address the literacy gap and improve literacy skills. Dr. McIntosh currently provides literacy instruction/intervention and science instruction in two Detroit schools. Her team of 10 consists primarily of retired teachers who still want to make a difference in the academic success of our children. They are trained in the Direct Instruction Method and use Reading Mastery and Corrective Reading Programs. In addition, they administer placement tests, group students according to the reading program level and provide 3 hours of reading intervention per group per week. Dr. McIntosh and her team have served the community for a decade now and have positively impacted the lives of over 400 students. Soror McIntosh has held many positions including principal, assistant professor and National youth director. Soror McIntosh holds a doctorate in Curriculum and Instruction.
